Provider Pals®, a 501(c) 3 non-profit education program, was a long time dream of Bruce's that took flight in 2002 due to the generous support of Ford Motor Company and Caterpillar. Its mission reflects the reasoning behind this award – building cross cultural bridges of communication that will foster respectful, responsible dialogue on vital issues that society faces in dealing with natural resources, the environment and growing populations.

Bruce has been married to his wife Patti Jo for over 30 years and has four children, two sons-in-law, and one granddaughter. His current activities represent a family commitment to responsible environmentalism.
